CAMBODIAN TEXTILE HUNT



4 NIGHTS PRIVATE TOUR

SIEM REAP/ KAMPON CHAM /PHNOM PENH

5 DAY TOUR

DAY 1: Today you drive from Siem Reap through rural Cambodia to the river town of Kampong Cham. Arriving mid afternoon you will visit a community project run by a group of local Buddhist monks where you will see how young people in the area are learning traditional arts including weaving and dance. After dinner at the local Smile restaurant (also run by the Buddhist monks) you will checkin to your hotel in Kampong Cham town.

DAY 2: An early start to the day you will take a boat ride to the island weaving villages at Prey Chung Kran. Before leaving for Phnom Penh we take a tour of some of the temples around Kampong Cham. Arriving in Phnom Penh around sunset you can check into your hotel located in the centre of the tourist area which is central to the major sites of the city.

DAY 3: This morning take a boat ride from Phnom Penh to the weaving village at Koh Dach. This afternoon you visit to Wat Phnom and the Cambodian Craft Cooperative to see how this organisation is helping revive traditional crafts and weaving.

DAY 4: You spend the morning hunting for fabrics and textiles with a visit to Central market, Olympic market and the wholesale fabric merchants for some bargain ikats and raw silks. Your afternoon is free to see some of Phnom Penh's sites. Must see's include the Royal Palace and S21.

DAY 5: Your tour finishes today after breakfast

Inclusions: 1 night Kampong Cham hotel; 3 nights Castle Hotel or Eueka Villa's; daily breakfast; English speaking guide and air-con car transport tours of Kampong Cham temples and community projects; Koh Dach weaving villages, Prey Chung Kran weaving villages; Wat Phnom; Cambodian Craft Cooperative; Central and Olympic markets and fabric wholesalers.
